




Why Women Like True Crime -continued -

TIPS TOWARD RISK REDUCTION

Here are a few tips that might help you reduce your chance of being victimized.

You are your own best protection. Keep your door locked at all times and don't unlock the door for strangers.

Keep first-floor windows locked and when you are out, walk in well-lit areas and stay near the curb, away from alleys, entry ways and bushes.

Do not walk or jog alone after dark and avoid short cuts if they take you away from other crowds of people.

Don't hitchhike or accept rides from strangers. If someone asks you for directions, stay far enough away that you' can't be pulled into their vehicle.

Don't pick up strangers.

If you are being followed when walking, change directions, vary speed and goo to a well-lit area where there are other people. If followed by someone in a car, turn and walk in the other direction, while recording the license number.

Park your car in a well-lit areas, and lock the doors.

If you are uncomfortable walking to your car, call security to escort you.
